#### DEVELOPMENT OF SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT

#### Sustainable transport is recognized as a key factor in sustainable development, starting from

The 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, when its role was emphasized in Agenda 21

Since then, various international documents and summits, such as the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation (2002) and the Rio+20 Conference (2012), have recognized the importance of transport for sustainable development.

## Important documents, including the "Ashgabat Declaration of Commitments and Policy Recommendations," were adopted

At the first Global Conference on Sustainable Transport in 2016 in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan

After this conference, the global situation has changed due to insufficient progress in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, the COVID-19 pandemic and the growing climate crisis, which has highlighted the urgency of accelerating towards sustainable transport.

## At a critical moment, when progress has been assessed and future steps have been defined in a context different from 2016, comes

The Second Global Conference on Sustainable Transport was scheduled for October 2021.

The conference also contributes to upcoming meetings such as the 26th Climate Change Conference and the 2022 High-Level Political Forum..

#### Recent initiatives have sought to bring together different actors, particularly with the aim of

Support for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and the Paris Agreement

One example is the Sustainable Mobility for All initiative, launched at the 2016 Climate Summit convened by the UN Secretary-General, which aims to unite different transport stakeholders and their collective action to help transform the transport sector.
